1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 1548

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend Senate Bill 1548 by replacing
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The Illinois State Police Law of the Civil
5 Administrative Code of Illinois is amended by changing Section
6 2605-485 as follows:

7 (20 ILCS 2605/2605-485)

8 Sec. 2605-485. Endangered Missing Person Advisory.

9 (a) A coordinated program known as the Endangered Missing
10 Person Advisory is established within the Illinois State
11 Police. The purpose of the Endangered Missing Person Advisory
12 is to provide a regional system for the rapid dissemination of
13 information regarding a missing person who is believed to be a
14 high-risk missing person as defined in Section 10 of the
15 Missing Persons Identification Act.

16 (b) The AMBER Plan Task Force, established under Section

1 2605-480 of this Law, shall serve as the task force for the
2 Endangered Missing Person Advisory. The AMBER Plan Task Force
3 shall monitor and review the implementation and operation of
4 the regional system developed under subsection (a), including
5 procedures, budgetary requirements, and response protocols.
6 The AMBER Plan Task Force shall also develop additional
7 network resources for use in the system.

8 (c) The Illinois State Police, in coordination with the
9 Illinois Department on Aging, shall develop and implement a
10 community outreach program to promote awareness among the
11 State's healthcare facilities, nursing homes, assisted living
12 facilities, and other senior centers. The guidelines and
13 procedures shall ensure that specific health information about
14 the missing person is not made public through the alert or
15 otherwise.

16 (c-5) Subject to appropriation, the Illinois State Police,
17 in coordination with the Illinois Department of Human
18 Services, shall develop and implement a community outreach
19 program to promote awareness of the Endangered Missing Person
20 Advisory among applicable entities, including, but not limited
21 to, developmental disability facilities as defined in Section
22 1-107 of the Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities
23 Code. The outreach program may also promote awareness of the
24 Endangered Missing Person Advisory to people with
25 developmental disabilities, as defined in Section 1-116 of the
26 Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities Code, communities

1 of people with developmental disabilities, and organizations
2 that serve people with developmental disabilities. The
3 guidelines and procedures shall ensure that specific health
4 information about the missing person is not made public
5 through the alert or otherwise.

6 (d) The Child Safety Coordinator, created under Section
7 2605-480 of this Law, shall act in the dual capacity of Child
8 Safety Coordinator and Endangered Missing Person Coordinator.
9 The Coordinator shall assist in the establishment of State
10 standards and monitor the availability of federal funding that
11 may become available to further the objectives of the
12 Endangered Missing Person Advisory. The Illinois State Police
13 shall provide technical assistance for the Coordinator from
14 its existing resources.

15 (e) (1) The Illinois State Police, in cooperation with the
16 Silver Search Task Force, shall develop as part of the
17 Endangered Missing Person Advisory a coordinated statewide
18 awareness program and toolkit to be used when a person 21 years
19 of age or older who is believed to have Alzheimer's disease,
20 other related dementia, or other dementia-like cognitive
21 impairment is reported missing, which shall be referred to as
22 Silver Search.

23 (2) The Illinois State Police shall complete development
24 and deployment of the Silver Search Awareness Program and
25 toolkit on or before July 1, 2017.

26 (3) The Illinois State Police shall establish a Silver

1 Search Task Force within 90 days after the effective date of
2 this amendatory Act of the 99th General Assembly to assist the
3 Illinois State Police in development and deployment of the
4 Silver Search Awareness Program and toolkit. The Task Force
5 shall establish the criteria and create a toolkit, which may
6 include usage of Department of Transportation signs, under
7 Section 2705-505.6 of the Department of Transportation Law of
8 the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois. The Task Force
9 shall monitor and review the implementation and operation of
10 that program, including procedures, budgetary requirements,
11 standards, and minimum requirements for the training of law
12 enforcement personnel on how to interact appropriately and
13 effectively with individuals that suffer from Alzheimer's
14 disease, other dementia, or other dementia-like cognitive
15 impairment. The Task Force shall also develop additional
16 network and financial resources for use in the system. The
17 Task Force shall include, but is not limited to, one
18 representative from each of the following:

19 (A) the Illinois State Police;

20 (B) the Department on Aging;

21 (C) the Department of Public Health;

22 (D) the Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards
23 Board;

24 (E) the Illinois Emergency Management Agency;

25 (F) the Secretary of State;

26 (G) the Department of Transportation;

1 (H) the Department of the Lottery;

2 (I) the Illinois Toll Highway Authority;

3 (J) a State association dedicated to Alzheimer's care,
4 support, and research;

5 (K) a State association dedicated to improving quality
6 of life for persons age 50 and over;

7 (L) a State group of area agencies involved in
8 planning and coordinating services and programs for older
9 persons in their respective areas;

10 (M) a State organization dedicated to enhancing
11 communication and cooperation between sheriffs;

12 (N) a State association of police chiefs and other
13 leaders of police and public safety organizations;

14 (O) a State association representing Illinois
15 publishers;

16 (P) a State association that advocates for the
17 broadcast industry;

18 (Q) a member of a large wireless telephone carrier;
19 and

20 (R) a member of a small wireless telephone carrier.

21 The members of the Task Force designated in subparagraphs
22 (A) through (I) of this paragraph (3) shall be appointed by the
23 head of the respective agency. The members of the Task Force
24 designated in subparagraphs (J) through (R) of this paragraph
25 (3) shall be appointed by the Director of the Illinois State
26 Police. The Director of the Illinois State Police or his or her

1 designee shall serve as Chair of the Task Force.

2 The Task Force shall meet at least twice a year and shall
3 provide a report on the operations of the Silver Search
4 Program to the General Assembly and the Governor each year by
5 June 30.

6 (4) Subject to appropriation, the Illinois State Police,
7 in coordination with the Department on Aging and the Silver
8 Search Task Force, shall develop and implement a community
9 outreach program to promote awareness of the Silver Search
10 Program as part of the Endangered Missing Person Advisory
11 among law enforcement agencies, the State's healthcare
12 facilities, nursing homes, assisted living facilities, other
13 senior centers, and the general population on or before
14 January 1, 2017.

15 (5) The Child Safety Coordinator, created under Section
16 2605-480 of this Law, shall act in the capacity of Child Safety
17 Coordinator, Endangered Missing Person Coordinator, and Silver
18 Search Program Coordinator. The Coordinator, in conjunction
19 with the members of the Task Force, shall assist the Illinois
20 State Police and the Silver Search Task Force in the
21 establishment of State standards and monitor the availability
22 of federal and private funding that may become available to
23 further the objectives of the Endangered Missing Person
24 Advisory and Silver Search Awareness Program. The Illinois
25 State Police shall provide technical assistance for the
26 Coordinator from its existing resources.

1 (6) The Illinois State Police shall provide administrative
2 and other support to the Task Force.
